H.L. Hunley conservation continues

Conservation of the Confederate submarine *H.L. Hunley* is progressing at a North Charleston facility. After soaking for over a decade in a tank of water and chemicals designed to both loosen crust and prevent corrosion, *Hunley* was then cleaned by conservators using hand held tools. 1,200 pounds of deposits, sediment, and rust were removed from the exterior hull. On 25 October, a convention meets in Milledgeville to repeal Georgia's ordinance of secession and amend or replace the 1861 constitution.

2016 tour with Ed Bearss will continue to follow the Atlanta Campaign


Those of you who were with us this past March will remember that we finished Sunday morning by visiting Pine Mountain, site of Lieutenant General Polk's death on 14 June 1864, and the Ector trench, which was the pivot for the Confederate pullback from the Lost Mountain Line to the Mud Creek Line late on 16 June. We'll begin touring Friday (11 March) morning by visiting Confederate and Federal trenches at Gilgal Church, site of fighting on 15 & 16 June. We'll next visit part of the Lost Mountain Line, then drive past parts of the Mud Creek Line. Lunch will be at the Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park visitors center, followed (weather permitting) by a visit to the summit. We'll finish the day visiting well-preserved earthworks on Brushy Mountain. Dinner that evening will be at the Southern Museum of Civil War and Locomotive History, which houses the *General*, the locomotive stolen by the Andrews raiders in April 1862. www.southernmuseum.org

Saturday (12 March) will focus on the three weeks the Confederates spent on the Kennesaw Mountain Line, 19 June-3 July 1864. This will include the near continual skirmishing and probing for advantage by the Federals, as well as the 27 June fighting at Pigeon Hill and Cheatham's Hill, known as the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Lunch will be on the battlefield. Dinner that evening will be at a restaurant in Marietta.

Sunday (13 March) will trace the Federal flanking movement that forced Confederate withdrawal to the Smyrna Line and led to the action on 4 July 1864.
