

Savannah tour 13-16 April 2023

Hotel: Hampton Inn & Suites Historic District at 603 W. Oglethorpe Ave. 912 721 1600. GBA rate is \$179 per night for Wednesday and Thursday nights and \$259 per night for Friday and Saturday nights. If you reserve for all four nights, it's \$219 per night. The almost 16% tax adds \$34.47 per night, for a daily total of \$253.47. Parking in the hotel lot is \$30 per night. Meals: Breakfast is included in the hotel price. Lunch and dinner are included in the tour price. **<u>Program:</u>** Thursday – Morning: Walking tour of the city's Revolutionary War sites. Afternoon: Walking tour of Bonaventure Cemetery. Evening: Reception buffet and program at the hotel. Friday – Seaward defenses of Savannah: Fort Pulaski, Old Fort Jackson (lunch), Wormsloe State Historic Site (Fort Wimberly). On the map below, a red X indicates one of the seaward forts or batteries built by the Confederates. The fall of Fort Pulaski in April 1862 meant the U.S. Navy had few reasons to test those defenses. Dinner at Mighty Eighth Air Force Museum. Saturday – Landward defenses of Savannah: Ebenezer Creek, Monteith Swamp, Bazemore Park, Shaw's Dam, King's Bridge (lunch), Fort McAllister. On the map, the red dashed line indicates the Confederate fortifications built as U.S. forces approached from the northwest in late 1864. The names in blue indicate the HQs of Sherman and his wing and corps commanders until 21 December 1864, when the Confederates abandoned the city. Dinner at The Pirates House. Sunday - Walking tour of Civil War sites in downtown Savannah. Tour ends at noon. Guide: Jim Ogden, Chickamauga & Chattanooga National Military Park historian. **Price:** \$460 per person for the usual Thursday night through Sunday morning tour of Civil War sites. \$120 additional for Thursday tours. So, \$580 per person includes all tours.
